## Subject

Walking Town Meeting in Lincoln Park Community

---

## Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Council conduct a walking town meeting in the Lincoln Park neighborhood with the Lincoln Park Civic Association.

---

## Discussion

The Mayor and Council will hold a walking town meeting with the Lincoln Park Civic Association on September 14, 2016, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Participants will meet at the Lincoln Park Community Center located at 357 Frederick Avenue for a walk through the neighborhood along a route identified by Lincoln Park Civic Association and staff. Free parking is available at the Lincoln Park Community Center.

The total route is 0.88 miles in length and includes several key stopping points (Attachment A). Participants are invited to join the Mayor and council at the start or at any of the following points through the walk:

- Head southwest on Frederick Avenue towards Moore Drive
- Turn right onto Moore Drive and continue to the end of the street
- Turn right onto Westmore Avenue end at the Wilma Bell Park
- U turn and continue south on Westmore Avenue
- Turn right on Elizabeth Avenue and continue to the end of street
- Turn left on N. Stonestreet Avenue
- End at 595 N. Stonestreet, Crusader Baptist Church

Lincoln Park Civic Association has provided items of discussion during the walk as follows:

- Sidewalk in the back of Legacy at Lincoln Park, North Horners Lane
- Future of the property located at 1000 Westmore Avenue; townhouses and other ideas

- Proposed Rockville Science Center

The Mayor and Council will be joined by City staff who will answer questions and participate in the conversation with neighborhood leaders and others who are invited to share observations and ask questions along the way.

### **Mayor and Council History**

This will be the first walking town meeting for this calendar year. Last year, a walk was held in the Hungerford neighborhood.

---

### **Public Notification and Engagement**

The City Clerk's/Director of Council Operations Office advertised the meeting as required for all Mayor and Council meetings. The Lincoln Park Civic Association and City staff notified neighbors using Nextdoor, Fliers, email, announce at the civic association meeting and their website. The City also posted signs in the neighborhood.



