

Fairwood Court Stormwater Management Facility Cleanout

Project Description: The City of Rockville's contractor, *Stormwater Maintenance*, will clean out the public underground stormwater management facility in the backyard of 12 Fairwood Court.

Purpose: The underground system is designed to slow the release of stormwater during large storms. Storm runoff carries sediment, leaves, and other debris into the pipes. When the debris buildup begins to interfere with the stormwater control, the facility must be cleaned out. Debris is suctioned into a truck and taken to a disposal site. Cleanout for this type of facility is needed only once every 10-20 years.

Work is scheduled to start between March 5 and March 12, and will take roughly five days to complete. Work may be delayed due to rain, snow, or daytime freezing temperatures.

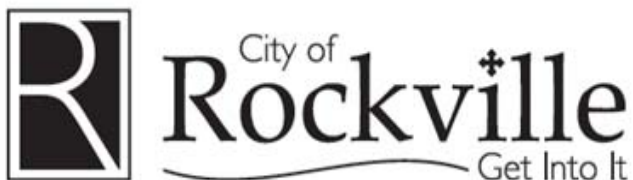
The contractor will park a vacuum truck on Fairwood Court during the project. There will be noise while the truck is in operation. The contractor will follow the Montgomery County noise ordinance standards. The cleaning will occur only on weekdays (Monday-Friday) between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Location: Backyard of 12 Fairwood Court.

Timeline: Five days, beginning March 5-12.
