

Hipsley-Thompson House




701 Grandin Avenue



This Victorian frame house was built ca. 1894 in the Rockville Park subdivision on the east side of the B & O railroad tracks. It is in the Gothic-Revival style, and is almost identical to the house at 709 Grandin (completed in 1893). The Victorian house features a steep center gable on the front facade and the original rear addition which complements the front block. The house is named for its long-term residents: the Hipsley family (1918-1951) and the Thompson/[Tolbert] family (1951-2002).
