Community Crime Prevention Tips

The Rockville City Police would like to provide residents with a few ways to protect your community from crime.

- Get to know your neighbors
- If you will be leaving your home for an extended period of time, ask a trusted neighbor if they can keep an eye on your property for anything out of the ordinary and to collect mail and deliveries that arrive while you are away.
- Consider installing video monitoring systems, security systems, and motion activated lights to help increase visibility around your property.
- Report broken windows, doors, vandalism, or suspicious activity to local law enforcement.
- Work with law enforcement and other community residents to monitor vacant homes.
- Contact your City, County, or Housing Authority to move snow from sidewalks, cut overgrown lawns or pick up the trash.
- Educate your children that it is not okay to go into an abandoned or vacant house.
- Discourage teenagers from using abandoned or vacant homes for parties.

Rockville City Police Reported Incidents

The Rockville City Police Department provides a weekly Crime Report of serious incidents to serve as an overview of police activity occurring within the City Limits of Rockville. Please note this summary does not include every reported incident that has occurred during this time frame.

It is to be noted that the words “arrested” and “charged” do not imply guilt.

ARRESTS
