POLICE CRIME REPORT

PROTECT YOUR RIDE FROM BICYCLE THEFT

The COVID-19 pandemic has been marred with a surge in bicycle purchases...and thefts. National estimates [show a 24% increase in thefts](#) between 2019 and 2020 alone. Before your bike is the next crime statistic, resolve today to secure it with a few tips:

- If you ride your bicycle to a retailer, restaurant, or public transit, try to **secure it in a garage** or [inquire with WMATA about a bike locker](#). Avoid locking your bike to trees and chain-link fences
- Store your bicycle **inside your home or apartment room** instead of a common-storage area (even if it's locked)
- **Snap a few photos** of your bicycle now and record your serial number with [ReportIt](#), a secure website that syncs with several databases accessible to law enforcement in case of theft
- Obviously, you should always lock your bicycle with a quality U-lock, but **don't forget to lock your frame and back-wheel together** along with a second lock for your front wheel
