KNOW THE SIGNS OF A SCAM

The [National Crime Prevention Council](#) reminds you that fraudsters use tricky tactics to create a sense of urgency and encourage you to lower your guard.

The next time someone calls or texts you and claims to be a customer service representative or authority figure, remember that a scammer may:

Be impatient, abrasive, pushy, or even rude

Be over-complimentary and make extra effort to relate to you

Evade your questions

Gain your trust by having you **verify some personal information**, then ask you for more

Try to **rush you** into a decision

Offer a deal that seems **“too good to be true”**

Trigger a one-time PIN for you and **ask you to read it back**

ARRESTS

09/20/22, a male, age 36, was arrested for trespassing, disorderly intoxication, and a weapons-law violation in the 2000 block of Tower Oaks Boulevard

1600 block of Rockville Pike, two subjects arrived in a vehicle and stole clothing from a business at 4:33 p.m. on 09/14/22.

100 block of First Street, a resident returned home to find her home's interior disturbed but only a sticker stolen and believes someone had entered between 1:10 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on 09/15/22.

800 block of Rockville Pike, video shows an unknown subject enter the unsecured "Employee only" section of a business and steal a wallet at 12:37 p.m. on 09/15/22.

1700 block of Rockville Pike, an unknown subject entered a business, sat down for a time, placed personal hygiene products in a bag and left at 4:30 p.m. on 09/15/22. **The subject is described as:**

Black male –about 30 years old thin build, goatee – Last seen wearing sunglasses and a black Puma baseball cap

200 block of E. Argyle Street, hearing glass breaking, a resident spotted two subjects standing nearby and then run away at 4:30 a.m. on 09/15/22.

Intersection of E. Middle Lane & N. Washington Street, a bar patron fell asleep intoxicated during the evening of 09/16/22 and awoke to find his phone missing and that someone had stolen his car.

800 block of Rockville Pike, video shows numerous subjects wearing ski-masks arrive in a car, shatter the window of another vehicle, and flee with it at 8:00 a.m. on 09/18/22.

1600 block of E. Gude Drive, video shows two subjects entering a business via a broken front door, steal merchandise, and flee at 3:06 a.m. on 09/18/22.

800 block of Rockville Pike, two subjects arrived in car, remotely unlocked another vehicle, and drove it away at Midnight on 09/19/22.
