PREPARING FOR HALLOWEEN, PART 1

Since October is just a long wait for Halloween, this month we'll highlight one set of Halloween tips per week.

Children may already be considering their Halloween costumes. As they do, consider these tips for costume safety:

- Make sure your child's costume is made of a **flame-retardant material**.
- **Keep costumes short** to prevent trips and falls.
- **Consider make-up instead of masks**, as masks may obstruct vision.
- Look for **brightly colored costumes** or affix reflective strips to costumes and bags.
- Have your child **carry a flashlight or glow sticks**.
- If your child's costume involves any kind of fake weapon, ensure it's made from a flexible material such as cardboard or foam.
- Make sure your child **wears comfortable shoes**.

ARRESTS

09/27/2022, a male, age 29, was arrested for DUI in the 900 block of First Street

200 block of Rockville Pike, a transit-rider left her purse inside a bus at 3:30 p.m. on 09/26/22 and believes it was stolen. **Incident Reported: 09/27/22.**

1800 block of Rockville Pike, a shopper approached a customer-service counter and was struggling paying for a carton of cigarettes when he suddenly snatched the carton and left at 12:07 p.m. on 09/27/22.

700 block of Rockville Pike, two students found their car windows shattered and wallets stolen between 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on 09/27/22.

1000 block of Rockville Pike, an unknown subject stole an employee's purse while she was distracted at 1:36 p.m. on 09/28/22. **The subject is described as:**

Black male—thin-build, wearing a "milky-colored" sweatshirt and blue jeans

Unit block of Mannakee Street, a vehicle-owner found that someone punctured two of her tires at 10:04 a.m. on 09/28/22.

1500 block of Rockville Pike, two unknown subjects asked to activate a gift card with insufficient cash. After the card was activated and while the cashier was distracted, the subjects swapped the activated card for an inactivated one at 7:15 p.m. on 10/01/22. **The subjects are described as:**

White or Hispanic male – medium-build, clean-shaven, dark hair in a buzz-cut, wearing all-black

White female – heavy-build, light complexion, wearing a white t-shirt, black winter coat with fur trim, and gray knit cap

1600 block of Rockville Pike, an unknown subject took a cashier's car keys, which were left in a plastic bag at a separate cash register, at 5:30 p.m. on 10/02/22.

400 block of Redland Boulevard, an unknown subject flipped a table and struck the complainant repeatedly with an umbrella amid an argument at 2:20 p.m. on 10/02/22. **The subjects are described as:**

Asian or Hispanic female – thin-build, 5 foot 4 inches tall, 120 lbs, wearing dark clothing with an orange backpack

Black Female – thin-build, 5 foot 4 inches tall, 120 lbs, wearing dark clothing
