POLICE CRIME REPORT

BE SAFE IF YOU'RE STRANDED IN COLD WEATHER

The uncomfortable plunge in temperatures this week can turn deadly if you get stranded in your car, such as in a long-standing traffic jam. Take a moment now to learn a few tips before winter arrives in earnest:

Signal rescuers: tie a brightly colored cloth to your car's exterior and raise its hood

Wrap your entire body, including your head, in extra clothing, blankets, or newspapers.
Keep moving your arms and legs as you sit, and **huddle with other people** for warmth.

Stay awake, as sleep may render you vulnerable to cold-related health problems.

Run the motor (and heater) for about 10 minutes per hour, opening one window slightly to let in air.

Make sure that snow is not blocking the exhaust pipe to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Do not eat snow, as it will lower your body temperature.
