BUZZED DRIVING IS DRUNK DRIVING

December is **National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month**, as it's one of the deadliest and most dangerous times on America's roadways. Below are facts provided by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration about impaired driving:

It is illegal to drive with a blood alcohol concentration at or above 0.08%, and such carelessness led to 10,142 deaths in 2019. Among children killed in motor vehicle crashes, almost one-fifth were killed in drunk-driving crashes and, fifty-three percent of the time, it was the child's own driver who was drunk.

At a BAC of 0.08%, muscle coordination becomes poor, and it's harder to detect danger. At this level, drinkers will find their judgment, self-control, reasoning, and memory impaired, even though they may still only feel "buzzed".

A single DUI could set you back \$10,000 in attorney's fees, fines, court costs, lost time at work, higher insurance rates, car towing, and more.

If you see someone on the road who you believe is driving impaired, call 9-1-1. Your actions could help save someone's life.
