WORK ZONE FATALITIES ARE GROWING

April 17-21 is **National Work Zone Awareness Week**, a campaign designed to shed light on a growing problem. From 2020 to 2021, work zone fatalities increased by 10.8 percent in Maryland.

Per the [Maryland State Highway Administration](#):

- **Work zones can be dangerous for you too.** In Maryland from 2017 to 2021, 1 out of every 2 people killed or injured in work-zone crashes are motorists.
- **Give room.** When safe, motorists should move over a lane to leave room for roadway workers to safely do their jobs.

ARRESTS

04/13/23, a male, age 30, was arrested for trespassing in the unit block of Maryland Avenue.

Hispanic male—30-to-34 years old, 5 foot, 11 inches tall, about 155 lbs, a black Adidas shirt and black Adidas shorts

300 block of King Farm Boulevard, a group of four subjects stole \$217 in liquor from a business by concealing the goods in their pants at 3:34 p.m. on 04/15/23.

1800 block of Rockville Pike, after she was greeted by a business’s employee, an unknown shopper began following the employee while berating and pushing her at 10:07 a.m. on 04/15/23. **The subject is described as:**

Black female—5 foot, 9 inches tall, about 200 lbs, with long black hair

15100 block of Frederick Road, walking among a group of male juveniles crossing a street, an unknown subject pointed a handgun at a motorist who had honked his horn at them at 12:25 a.m. on 04/15/23.

Unit block of Maryland Avenue, a group of young male subjects arrived on bicycles, accompanied by one unknown male subject on foot. This latter subject hopped on a visitor’s unsecured electric scooter and rode away at 5:29 p.m. on 04/16/23.

Unit block of Gibbs Street, three unknown masked subjects wearing all-black and with gloves shattered the window to a business with a sledgehammer to steal jewelry at 4:58 a.m. on 04/16/23.
