PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST PICKPOCKETS

Pickpocketing isn't only a concern for travelers. Whether you're traveling domestically, internationally, or simply running errands in-town, abide by these easy tips to help protect your valuables:

- **Forget pickpocketing stereotypes.** Pickpockets operate equally well during daylight and nighttime hours, operate both alone and in teams, and appear with remarkable diversity across all ages, genders, and racial/ethnic groups.
- Keep valuables in your **front pants or outerwear pocket**, especially if they can be secured with a button or zipper.
- **Avoid patting your pocket** to see if your wallet, phone, or keys are still there. This notifies the criminal of the location of your valuables.
